IMPLEMENTATION ORDER RE )  
EMERGENCY RELIEF AUTHORIZED )  
PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE )  
SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR OF )  
JUDICIAL COUNCIL )

On May 1, 2020, the Court issued an Order implementing a judicial emergency order allowing the Fresno Superior Court to, inter alia, extend the time periods provided in sections 632 and 637 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending wardship proceedings and charged with a felony must be given a detention hearing or rehearing. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11)). This Court's authority for the requested extension was expressly sought and granted for the period from May 4, 2020 until May 29, 2020.

In the same Order this Court reiterated that, pursuant to the Chief Justice's March 30, 2020 statewide order the, Court continued to extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination and

1 the defendant's right to release from 10 court days to **not more**  
2 **than 30 court days**. (May Order, para. 4, p.3, lines 24-28.).


3 Similarly, pursuant to the Chief Justice's April 29, 2020  
4 statewide order, the 60-day continuance of criminal jury trials  
5 and the 60-day extension of time in which to conduct a criminal  
6 trial under Penal Code section 1382 were extended an additional 30  
7 days. The total extension of 90 days was to be calculated from  
8 the last date on which the trial initially could have been  
9 conducted under Penal Code section 1382. (May Order, para. 6, p.  
10 4, lines 6-21).

11 Finally, in the May 1, 2020, order of this Court, pursuant to  
12 the Chief Justice's March 30, 2020, statewide order, the Court  
13 continued to extend the time period provided in Code of Civil  
14 Procedure sections 583.310 and 583.320 for the holding of a civil  
15 trial for a period of **sixty (60) days** from the last date on which  
16 the statutory deadline otherwise would have expired. (May Order,  
17 para. 8, p. 4, line 27 - p. 5, line 8).

18 As the Court works to overcome the detrimental impact the  
19 current pandemic has had on court operations, it was on May 1,  
20 2020, and has been since, the intent of this Court to implement  
21 the statewide orders of the Chief Justice to their fullest.

22 Such statewide orders and this Court's implementation of  
23 those orders remains in effect until the Chief Justice rescinds or  
24 modifies them. To date the Chief Justice has taken no such action.
