THE FOLLOWING CASE TYPES PREVIOUSLY SCHEDULED AND SET ON
CALENDAR TO BE HEARD BETWEEN APRIL 6, 2020, AND MAY 1, 2020, ARE
ORDERED RESET AND CONTINUED AS FOLLOWS:

A. In Custody Defendant Arraignment

The arraignment hearing for a defendant who is in custody and
set for April 6, 2020 and April 7, 2020 will be reset to April 8,
2020.

B. Out of Custody Defendant Arraignment

The arraignment hearing for a defendant who is out of custody
will be reset for sixty (60) calendar days.

C. In Custody Defendant Sentencing

The sentencing hearing for a defendant who is in custody will
be reset for twenty (20) Court days.

1 D. **Out of Custody Defendant Sentencing**

2 The sentencing hearing for a defendant who is out of custody
3 will be reset for thirty (30) Court days.

4 E. **Existing Pre-Preliminary Hearing**

5 The existing pre-preliminary hearing for a defendant will be
6 reset for twenty (20) Court days from the currently set date if a
7 general time waiver has been entered. If not, counsel will be
8 asked that a written Penal Code section 977 waiver, along with a
9 general time waiver, be provided.

10 F. **Existing Settlement Conference / Pre-Trial Hearing**

11 The settlement conference / pre-trial hearing will be reset
12 for twenty (20) Court days if a general time waiver has been
13 entered. If not, counsel will be asked that a written Penal Code
14 section 977 waiver, along with a general time waiver, be provided.

15 G. **In Custody Preliminary Hearing**

16 The preliminary hearing for a defendant who is in custody
17 will be reset for fifteen (15) Court days.

18 H. **Out of Custody Preliminary Hearing**

19 The preliminary hearing for a defendant who is out of custody
20 will be reset for twenty-eight (28) calendar days if a general
21 time waiver has been entered. If not, counsel will be asked that
22 a written Penal Code section 977 waiver, along with a general time
23 waiver, be provided.

24 I. **Jury Trials**

25 Jury trials will be reset for sixty (60) calendar days if a
26 general time waiver has been entered. If not, counsel will be
27 asked that a written Penal Code section 977 waiver, along with a
28 general time waiver, be provided.

1 J. **Held to Answer Arraignment**

2 Held to answer arraignments will be reset for thirty (30)
3 calendar days.

4 K. **Miscellaneous Proceedings**

5 1. Conditional Settlement: Conditional settlement
6 review and conditional settlement hearings will be continued one
7 hundred twenty (120) calendar days.

8 2. Bail Review: Bail review hearings will be
9 continued thirty (30) calendar days.

10 3. Law and Motion: Law and motion matters will be
11 continued for thirty (30) calendar days.

12 4. Mental Health: Mental health hearings will be
13 continued for sixty (60) calendar days.

14 5. General Motions: General motions will be continued
15 for the same time period as the primary associated hearing.
16 Stand-alone general motions will be continued for ninety (90)
17 calendar days.

18 6. The following hearing types will be continued for
19 sixty (60) calendar days.

20 a. Deferred Entry of Judgment

21 b. FTA-PC 1000 Drug Diversion

22 c. Initial Review - Prop 36

2 M. **Behavioral Health Court and Veteran's Treatment Court**


3 All Behavioral Health Court and Veteran's Treatment Court reviews
