

Amnesty Eligibility Criteria and FAQs

When does the Amnesty Program begin and end?

January 1st, 2012 to June 30th, 2012

What violations are eligible?

All adult and juvenile vehicle and non-vehicle infraction violations.

How do I know if I'm eligible?

All of the following conditions must be met to be eligible:

- You have an outstanding traffic case that was due to be paid in full before January 1st, 2009, and
- You either failed to appear in court or failed to pay in full.
- The last date you made a payment was on or before January 1, 2009.
- You do not owe Court ordered restitution to a victim on any case within Fresno County.
- You do not have an active Misdemeanor or Felony Warrant within Fresno County.

What about assessments and other fees that have been tacked on?

If you are found eligible for the Amnesty Program, the total amount due on your case will be reduced by 50%. That includes the base fine and any assessments, late charges, and other fees. However, if a civil assessment fee was added to your case after January 1, 2009, your case is not eligible for the amnesty program.

Will I be able to renew my driver's license if I participate in the Amnesty Program?

Once the court has confirmed you have met the eligibility criteria, the hold placed on your California driver's license will be lifted. Will the point on my driving record from this case be removed?

No, the amnesty program does NOT eliminate points.

How do I request amnesty?

- You must complete the amnesty affidavit form, TTR-60. You may print out the amnesty affidavit form from our website at www.fresnosuperiorcourt.org or pick up a form at the amnesty window located at 1100 Van Ness walk up windows located at the B-1 moat, and
- You must pay 50% of the amount due in one lump sum. Payments will NOT be accepted.

How do I know if I met the criteria for amnesty?

- The court will review your affidavit and confirm your eligibility within 35 court days.
- Once your eligibility has been confirmed or denied, a notice will be sent to the address provided on your affidavit form.
- If you meet all of the qualifications for the amnesty program, the monies you posted will be applied to your case and it will be deemed paid in full. If you do NOT meet all of the criteria of the amnesty program, the monies you posted will be applied in the following order:
 1. To any Court ordered victim restitution you may currently owe in Fresno County.
 2. To your infraction case and you are responsible for paying the remaining balance due.
