ORDER RE IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY THE CHAIR OF THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL GENERAL ORDER RE TRAFFIC PROCEEDINGS

Due to the health concerns presented by the coronavirus and its associated disease COVID-19, and the Emergency Order of the Presiding Judge of the Fresno Superior Court and the Statewide Order of the Chief Justice of California,

## THIS COURT HEREBY AUTHORIZES THE FOLLOWING:

The Court will begin hearing a limited number of infraction trials starting Monday, May 11, 2020. All trials will be Remote Video Proceedings conducted via the Zoom application. Only matters where a prior agreement is obtained that all parties can appear from a remote location via the Zoom application are being scheduled at this time.

If you have an infraction case that is set for trial, the Court will notify you regarding permissions and any new potential trial date via Remote Video Proceedings. If the matter is General Order Re Traffic Proceedings

scheduled to be a Remote Video Proceeding via Zoom, specific instructions will be included in the notice.

Remote proceedings conducted at the M Street Courthouse will be added to the list of available courtroom live streams as soon as practicable.

From May 11, 2020 until May 29, 2020, inclusive, the Clerk's office at the M Street Courthouse will remain closed, as will the morning walk-in calendar.

As set out in the Notification Regarding Appearance and Payment Dates for Cases at the M Street Courthouse posted on the Court's website, you may continue to make payments online, through the mail, or by using the Court's drop-box. The Court will be temporally suspending collections activity until June 22, 2020. If you fail to make a payment by June 19, 2020, a civil assessment of up to \$300.00 may be added to your balance and your account may be referred to a collections agency.

This Order specifically amends the General Order dated May 1, 2020 and posted on the Court's website to the extent that it adds traffic trials, where prior agreement is obtained that the trial can be held remotely and all parties can appear from a remote location via the Zoom application, to the list of proceedings that are being held prior to May 29, 2020.
