Tentative Ruling

Re:	Molina v. Community Medical Centers Superior Court Case No. 16CECG00071
Hearing Date:	May 17, 2022 (Dept. 503)
Motion:	Defendants' Petition to Confirm Arbitration Order and Award

Tentative Ruling:

To grant. The court will sign the proposed judgment. (Code Civ. Proc., § 1287.4.)

The arbitration status conference set for May 17, 2022 is vacated.

Explanation:

The order and award of the arbitrator, in favor of defendants, was issued on June 29, 2021. No petition to vacate or correct this award was filed with the court prior to the 100-day jurisdictional time limit, which expired on October 7, 2021. (Code Civ. Proc., § 1288.) This petition to confirm was brought within the statutory four-year period from issuance of the award. (*Ibid.*) Judicial review of arbitration awards is limited to specific statutory grounds (e.g., Code of Civil Procedure sections 1286.2 and 1286.6), none of which have been raised. Therefore, it is proper to grant the petition.

Pursuant to California Rules of Court, rule 3.1312(a), and Code of Civil Procedure section 1019.5, subdivision (a), no further written order is necessary. The minute order adopting this tentative ruling will serve as the order of the court and service by the clerk will constitute notice of the order.
