Due to the health concern presented by the surge in novel coronavirus cases in Fresno County, and the County's continued placement in the Purple (widespread risk) Tier by the State of California, the Court orders that court operations proceed as described below:

1. <u>IN-CUSTODY MISDEMEANOR, FELONY, AND VIOLATION OF</u> SUPERVISION HEARINGS

The Court will hear in-custody (misdemeanor, felony, and violation of supervision) criminal cases. All parties are encouraged to attend hearings via Zoom. Counsel is strongly encouraged to obtain a waiver of the defendant's personal appearance, pursuant to Penal Code § 977 (977 waiver).

2. OUT OF CUSTODY FELONY AND MISDEMEANOR ARRAIGNMENT AND VIOLATION OF SUPERVISION HEARINGS

The Court hereby finds good cause to continue felony and misdemeanor out-of-custody defendant arraignment hearings and violation supervision arraignment hearings, including of probation, Community, and Parole Mandatory, Post Release supervision, where an attorney has not yet made an appearance.

If an out of custody defendant fails to appear as ordered or cited, an arrest warrant will issue for the defendant. If an out of custody defendant is not represented by an attorney in the case set for a hearing, the defendant will receive a new court date when he or she appears as ordered or cited and signs a promise to appear form. The time of any new appearance date will 8:30 a.m.

A defendant who has a private or public attorney should contact the attorney's office before the court date. The attorney may be able to appear on the defendant's behalf. Counsel is encouraged to appear on behalf of the client, using the 977 waiver. If the defendant appears at the Main Courthouse, the matter will be addressed by court personnel and the defendant will be advised to contact their attorney immediately.

3. OTHER FELONY HEARINGS

All other cases will proceed as currently set, utilizing remote hearing processes already in place. All attorneys are encouraged to obtain a waiver of defendant's personal appearance pursuant to Penal Code, § 977.

4. OTHER MISDEMEANOR HEARINGS

All other cases, other than jury trials, will proceed as currently set, utilizing remote hearing processes already in

place. All attorneys are encouraged to utilize the waiver of defendant's personal appearance pursuant to Penal Code, § 977.

5. TRAFFIC

The Traffic Division will continue current operations. Zoom appearances are available for arraignment and court trials and are strongly encouraged. Personal appearances in Court are discouraged.

The Traffic Department will continue to hold the morning arraignment calendar from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., heard Monday through Wednesday, with limited seating if appearing in-person. A request to appear remotely via Zoom could be made, but the request must be submitted for consideration three (3) days before the hearing.

Traffic Court Trial hearings will continue as scheduled either in-person or via Zoom.

The Traffic Department's Clerk's office will only be open for customers checking-in for a hearing.

6. JUVENILE DELINQUENCY

Juvenile Delinquency proceedings will continue to be heard, pursuant to Juvenile Justice Court procedures, in light of the current California Rules of Court, Emergency Rules 3 and 7.

7. JUVENILE DEPENDENCY

Juvenile Dependency will continue to hear all cases, in light of the current California Rules of Court, Emergency Rules 3 and 6. All parties are encouraged to utilize Zoom. However, if parties appear in person will go through the screening process and the Court Security Unit will send them to the 2nd-floor dependency clerk's office. Staff will check in the parties and direct them to the appropriate courtroom.

These procedures also apply to the Family Dependency
Treatment Court.

8. FAMILY LAW

All Family Law and Family Law DCSS matters will continue to be heard as scheduled, with the following exceptions:

All trials/long cause contested hearings may be continued on a case by case basis. If continued, the hearing will be rescheduled to a trial setting date in the department of origin. Notices will be sent with the new hearing dates and times.

Courtroom appearances are limited to attorneys and parties on the case. In departments utilizing Zoom, attorneys and selfrepresented litigants are strongly encouraged to appear remotely whenever possible (unless ordered to be present), however, inperson appearances are still allowed.

Attorneys and self-represented litigants are strongly encouraged to appear via CourtCall for Case Management Conferences in Department 202 on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings, and for Settlement Conferences in Department 202 on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons, however, in-person appearances are still allowed.

9. CIVIL UNLIMITED

All civil unlimited mandatory settlement conferences, trial readiness hearings, and jury trials scheduled to occur from Tuesday, February 16, 2021, through Wednesday, March 17, 2021, inclusive, will be rescheduled to occur on later dates in 2021 and 2022. All of these cases will be re-noticed for Trial Setting Conferences to be held on Thursday, March 18, 2021, at 9:00 a.m., in Department 503. The new settlement conference, trial readiness hearing, and trial date will be assigned at that time based upon a case-by-case assessment. Appearance by CourtCall is strongly encouraged.

Court trials scheduled to occur from Tuesday, February 16, 2021, through Wednesday, March 17, 2021, inclusive, will remain on calendar but may be continued on a case-by-case basis.

The Trial Setting Conferences currently set for Wednesday, February 17, 2021, at 9:00 a.m., in Department 503, will remain on calendar. Appearance by CourtCall is strongly encouraged.

Effective February 16, 2021, civil unlimited law and motion will return to Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, at 3:30 p.m.,
